The money The Friends of Springfield School raise goes towards a variety of equipment, activities and experiences that enrich the pupils education, provide them with opportunities to gain independence and enable them to access the curriculum with greater ease. At present we are fundraising for a new minibus as two of the four we currently have are very much on their last legs. A significant proportion of funds raised will be ear-marked for a minibus, however we will still be providing financial support to the school for a myriad of other items.
