The **Values Tree** identifies the specific Values that are promoted across the whole school community.

These Values cover the areas of Spiritual, Moral, Social, Cultural [SMSC] development and the fundamental British Values of:

- democracy
- the rule of law
- individual liberty
- mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith.

Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE) is at the heart of our school which emphasises the difference between right and wrong; respect and tolerance for differences in a very diverse and modern Britain.

Staff are expected to support children's personal, social and emotional development by helping them to develop a positive sense of themselves, and others; to form positive relationships and develop respect for others; to develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups; and to have confidence in their own abilities.

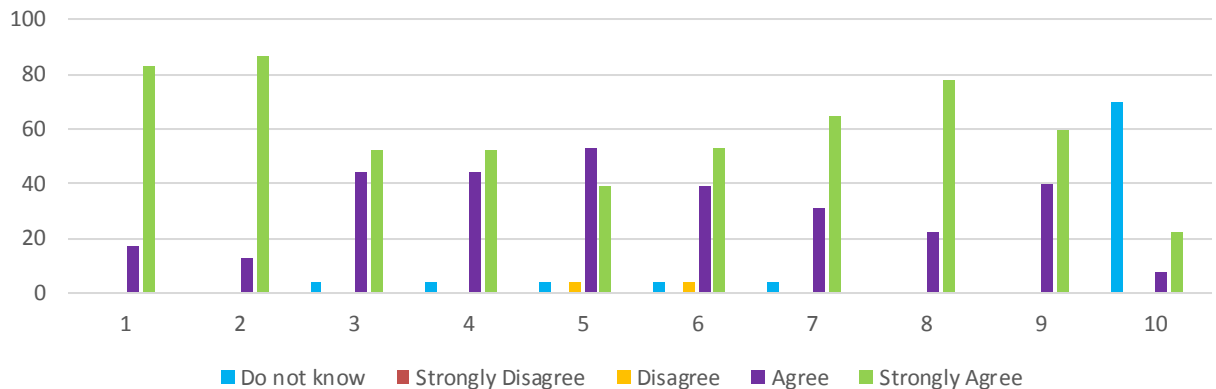
We recognise that such development is most successful when those values and attitudes are promoted by all the staff and provide a model of behaviour for our pupils.

The information from this survey along with a range of monitoring across the school during the year, helps to inform the priorities for our School Improvement Plan. Once this has been finalised, it will be shared with parents and put on our website.

Naturally, we would like to increase the number of responses indicating that parents / carers strongly agree with the given statements. The four statements to focus on are being safe; making good progress; high expectations of behaviour and responding to concerns. It is key to remember that the responses are very positive and that the focus on these areas is to move from good to outstanding.
